June 19, 2018

Dear Steve:

Following prayerful discernment, you have been assigned pastor of Newport United Methodist Church and are being sent to lead the congregation to carry out its mission of making and equipping disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

We affirm God's vision for the congregation to become a healthy, vital expression of Jesus' imperatives to (1) love God and neighbor, (2) reach new people, and (3) heal a broken world. We are grateful for your specific leadership gifts and competencies that will enable the Newport United Methodist Church to fulfill this mission and vision, and we thank God for your faithful response to God's call upon your life and for your humble acceptance of this particular assignment.

As you begin your ministry with this congregation and the community it serves, the following ministry opportunities will need your specific attention to:

- Lead congregation in discerning a vision and strategy for Newport to live into a new life cycle

MUSHROOM SOUP À LA CAFÉ BUDAPEST, to serve 12

INGREDIENTS:

1 stick butter (4 oz.)

1 small onion, diced (1/2 cup)

1 ½ lbs. mushrooms, sliced thinly

5 Tbsp all-purpose flour

7 cups cold water

½ oz. dried mushrooms
Juice of ½ lemon (1 Tbsp.)

1/4 tsp freshly ground black pepper

2 Tbsp granulated chicken base

1 Tbsp salt

2 cups light cream

1 cup sour cream

½ bunch parsley chopped fine (3 Tbsp)

1 cup croutons for garnish

½ bunch parsley chopped coarse for garnish

Paul Gaboriault.

Paul spent a number of years apprenticing in hotel and restaurant kitchens throughout New England, developing friendships and collecting many recipes, which have been featured from time to time in the Key. With each of these recipes comes a great story; one day with his permission we will compile them all, with the stories, for you. [Ed.]

PROCEDURE:

Wash the dried mushrooms in cold water, then place them in a bowl and cover them with boiling water. Soak 30 minutes.

Melt the butter in a 4-quart saucepan and add the diced onion, sautéing it until translucent.

Add half of the sliced fresh mushrooms and sauté over low heat until the liquid is evaporated.

Add the flour, blending it with the wire whisk, and cook for 3 to 5 minutes.

Dissolve chicken base in a little cold water and add to the contents of the saucepan, stirring until smooth.

Add the remaining fresh mushrooms, soaked dried mushrooms and their liquid, the lemon juice, 7 cups of cold water, salt and pepper, and bring to a boil.

Reduce heat, cook 10-15 minutes.

Add the light cream, the sour cream, and the finely chopped parsley, blending with a whisk, and use a spatula to detach any bits that have stuck to the bottom of the pan.

Simmer 10 to 15 minutes.

Adjust the seasoning.

Serve in large soup plates (not bowls) and garnish with coarsely chopped parsley and croutons.
